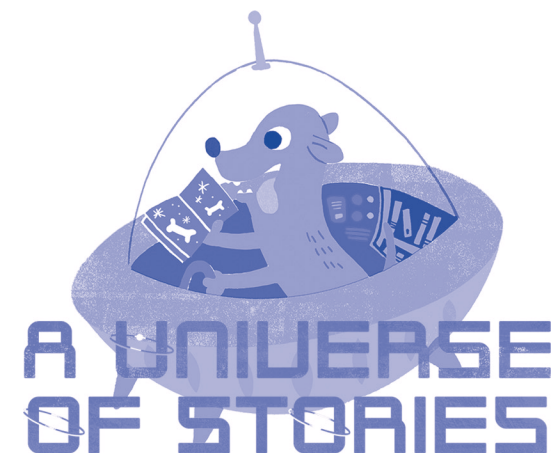

Learning to read begins at birth.

Help your baby or toddler be ready to read! Practice these early literacy activities:

- **Read to your baby or toddler.** Sharing books lets your child know that reading is important. Make reading together a special time.
- **Talk and sing with your baby or toddler.** Hearing sounds that make up words helps children sound out written words as they begin to read. Singing, talking, and reading with your child can help prepare them for success when they begin school.
- **Write and scribble with your baby or toddler.** Writing or scribbling helps children learn that the written word also stands for spoken language.
- **Play with your baby or toddler.** Sing silly songs, listen to music, and share rhymes and fingerplays.
- **Visit the library often with your child.** Select books together and attend library programs.
